

The Role of International Institutions in Addressing Current Environmental Challenges

Despite a huge efforts of the international community in direction of environmental protection, the world is facing serious environmental challenges. In recent years, the Triple Planetary Crises have been clearly identified, which refers to climate change, biodiversity loss and pollution. In addition, based on the results of particular studies and monitoring, it is clear that the implementation of 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), established within the framework of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, adopted by the UN General Assembly in 2015, as a roadmap for the restoration of the natural world, is not effective.
